- 2. Why is God so dissatisfied with the spiritual life of his people?

- 4. When the word "justice" is mentioned, what images come to your mind?
- 5. Can you name three current issues, locally or globally that have to do with social justice (i.e. with a concern for right relationship with God and neighbour)? How important are they to you?
