Pour In, Pour Out The Bread of the Kingdom: Amos 8:11,12; John 6:35-40

Discussion Points February 2, 2020

Read/Reflect

- 1. Read Amos 8.
 - a. What is it that brings on the judgment of God (vss. 3-6)?
 - b. Judgement is portrayed as earthquake (vs.8), eclipse/darkness (vs.9), a funeral (vs.10), famine (vs.11), and drought (vs.12). Which sounds the worst to you?
 - c. What are the thoughts or feelings that this passage stirs in your own heart and mind?
 - d. What would a famine of the Word of the Lord be like? What would be missing? What would or wouldn't happen?
- 2. Read John 6:25-40
 - a. What is Jesus' claim in saying that he is "the bread of life?"
 - b. How do you hear Jesus' declaration: outrageous, ordinary, satisfying or ...?

Explore

- 3. In what ways might we be inviting God's judgment compared to the people of Amos' time?
- 4. In what ways might we be like the crowds of people with Jesus in being attracted to things other than the true bread of life?
- 5. Where have you noticed a famine of God's Word. What would it mean for you to share the bread of the kingdom there?
- 6. How can Jesus' assurance that "he will lose none that the Father has given him" (vs.39,40) encourage you to share the bread of the Kingdom?

Pray

- Invite the Spirit to open your eyes and recognize the spiritual hunger around you, and equip you to share the bread of life. (Acts 1:8)
- See also the harvest, and pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out harvest, workers (Matthew 9:36-38).
