Uncomplicating the Complicated – Matthew 11:28-30

Read/Reflect

- 1. Read Matthew 11:28-30 quietly. Then read it aloud, noticing a word or phrase that stands out for you. Take a moment to reflect on that word or phrase and how it applies in your life right now.
- 2. What connections can you make between your use of digital devices and this passage?

Explore

- 3. Living in a computerized age, with what burdens do you identify in your own life?
 - More connection, greater loneliness
 - □ More productivity, higher stress
 - □ More leisure, less rest
 - □ More opportunity, more complexity
- 4. What does it mean to put on Jesus' yoke for how you think of discipleship (i.e. following Jesus)?
 - □ I have to do all the right things (just another burden).
 - □ There are no demands to following Jesus (he said it was easy).
 - □ My righteousness comes from the person of Jesus (discipleship = relationship).
 - Jesus' gentleness and humility are incentive for me to live like him (becoming more righteous).
- 5. In what ways do your devices help you in being a servant to all? And in what ways do your devices hinder a servant heart?
- 6. What practices help you to "be a slave to Christ" rather than a slave to your devices?
 - □ I stay intentional about my screen time. (How?)
 - □ I take time to focus/meditate/rest on God (when?)
 - □ I take a sabbath from my devices (in what way?)
 - □ I simplify my life in the following way(s). . .

- Pray for a servant heart in your use of devices and social media.
- Pray for clear vision on what it means to be really alive in Jesus.
- Pray that in your use of technology you reflect the values of a disciple of Jesus who finds rest in him rather than in the distractions that online activity offers.
