Read/Reflect

- 1. Read Ephesians 4:1-7. What kind of picture develops in your mind as you reflect on this passage?
- 2. Read Philippians 3:20-21. What kind of picture develops in your mind from these verses? Is it compatible with the picture from Ephesians 4, or with the life you live right now?

Explore

- 3. What is your definition of a good citizen in any circumstance? Have you ever lived in a place (or even a different time) where good citizenship had different values than your own?
- 4. How does being online make you think about good citizenship?
- 5. In what ways do your digital devices distract you from the goal of living to the glory of God or from living in (comm)unity?

 - Being humble and gentle (because I recognize the limits of human reason, including my own; and because if I'm not humble I will only foster pride and arrogance),
 - Being patient (because we won't always reach agreement on all the difficult issues of our time, and because our hope is in the completed story of salvation),
 - Bearing with one another in love (because our love of neighbour (even enemies) is rooted in the love of God, and because love casts out fear).
