Read/Reflect

- 1. Read Nahum 1 (also ch.2 & 3 perhaps). How does hearing this prophecy impact you if you read it:
 - As if you are an offending Ninevite
 - □ As if you are an Israelite captured by Ninevites
 - As if you are an indifferent outsider
- 2. From Nahum 1:2-10 draw as many descriptions as you can of God and his character.

Explore

- 3. What is your impression of the message of the Minor Prophets?
 - □ It's all judgments from God

□ It makes God look mean and angry

□ What is it doing in the Bible?

- Could it be a part of the Good News?
- 4. What is your reaction to Nahum's prophecy? Is it a warning for the faithful not to go against God? Or is it encouragement to the faithful, and then is it right to be comforted by God eliminating the enemy?
- 5. How does this prophecy fit into God's larger plan to bring salvation to the world? Where is God's mercy, love and compassion in this prophecy?
- 6. When have you longed for God's punishment on wickedness? Have you ever been impatient with God's timing for judgment on evil and injustice?
- 7. How would you apply this prophecy to you personally?
 - □ I hate evil like God does, but I will let him be the judge and vindicator.
 - □ I hate the evil in my own life, through Jesus, God be gracious to me, a sinner.
