



The Holy Spirit Water John 7:37-39

Read/Reflect

- 1. What is the Festival that Jesus is attending here in John 7, what does it commemorate and what does it have to do with verses 37-39?
- 2. Sometimes it is difficult to get the exact translation of a sentence, as is evident in John 7:38. There are two possibilities (and the second even has two possibilities):

³⁷ On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me *and drink.* ³⁸ *Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them."* ³⁹ By this he meant the Spirit,



³⁷ On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me. **And let anyone drink** ³⁸ **who believes in me." As Scripture has said, "Out of him (or them) will flow rivers of living water.** ³⁹ By this he meant the Spirit,

- 4. How exactly is the Spirit or the action of the Spirit like "living water?" See also John 4:13-14
- 5. Considering the Spirit's action of shaping you, how would you describe the Holy Spirit in your life?
