



Christmas Light

Light that Beckons - Isaiah 2:1-11

Read/Reflect

- 1. In Isaiah's vision concerning Judah and Jerusalem, the mountain of the house of the LORD will be established as the highest of the mountains. What happens in the vision as a result of this?
- 2. What do you think "walking in the light of the LORD" in v.5 means? Are there other verses or passages from the Bible that might help with better understanding what this might look like?
- 3. Verse 6 begins with the conjunction "for," which provides the reason why Isaiah is inviting the house of Jacob to walk in the light of the LORD. What is the reason (vv.6-8) and what will God do as a response to what they have done (v.11)?
- 4. What do you think the vision of the Last Days in vv.2-4 reveal about God's ultimate plan for humanity?

Explore

- 1. What might be some "idols" that may hinder us from walking in the "light of the LORD" during the season of Advent?
- 2. What are the ways in which we could walk in obedience to God's ways during the season of Advent?
- 3. What steps can we take during the season of Advent to ensure we are walking in the light of the Lord?
- 4. How might we adore Jesus this week as we enter into the season of Advent? What might that look like practically in our own lives? Share with your life group specific ways in which you could commit to adoring Jesus daily this week.

Response/Prayer

- As you close your meeting, sing "O Come Let Us Adore Him" together as a group.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to help you to enter in to this season of Advent with the posture of adoration.

"Holy God, open our hearts to welcome your Son once again. Remove the things that hinder us from adoring Christ in this season of Advent so that we may walk in His Light and wait joyfully for the day of His return when He will come again in glory. Amen."
