- 1. Read John 14:4-11. Cultural context: when a man and woman were married the man would return to his (parent's) home to prepare a place for he and his wife to live. Jesus seems to be referring to this custom when he is trying to explain his departure. If so, how does that help you to understand what Jesus is explaining?
- 2. How much of the disciples' anxiety do you think is resolved by Jesus' response? What parts of his response may have been more confusing to the disciple, and/or to you?
