



ACTS – A Church Sent A Church at Odds

Read/Reflect

Read Acts 15:1-35

- 1. Some Pharisees insisted that Gentiles who became Christian "must be circumcised and required to obey the law of Moses." What kinds of things might that have included? (See Mark 2:16, 18, 24; 7:1-5)
- 2. What is Peter's experience with this issue like? See Acts 15:7-11; 10:9-20, 27-29; Galatians 2:11-16.

Explore

- 3. What behavioral norms or expectations are placed upon you because you confess to be a Christian? Do you resist these expectations, or do you follow them because they are part of being "in Christ?"
- 4. How do you determine what behaviors or activities are characteristic of being a follower of Christ, and which ones are "mere traditions"? What role does grace play in this kind of determination? When does grace become "cheap grace?"
- 5. If you were James, making a final declaration for today's context, how would you complete his judgment (see verses 19-20): "... we should not make it difficult for the [new believers] who are turning to God. Instead we should write [speak] to them, telling them ...?
- 6. How easy is it for you to accept the decision of a collective body, especially in a church context? When should you comply with a decision that you don't necessarily agree with for the sake of Christian humility and unity?

Pray

- ... for unity in the church, even as our society appears to become more and more individualized and fragmented.
- ... for the Holy Spirit's presence and wisdom as we seek guidance for the church and for faithfulness in following Jesus.
