## Read/Reflect

1. Read Job 1:1-12. What's your initial reaction to this scenario; what questions immediately pop up for you?

- 2. The general assumption in Israelite culture was that goodness was always rewarded, and bad deeds were always punished. Identify the ways that Job is characterized. Why is he characterized in this way? How does that set up the point of the entire book?
- 3. Read Job 2:11-13. Is the silence of Job's three friends appropriate? How would you have reacted to Job?

## Explore

- 4. When you've gone through a time in which you thought God owed you an explanation, or you simply longed to hear from God, what did you do? How did things turn out?
- 5. What do you think of a God who sets Job up for some extreme suffering?
- 6. What happens to your faith when God is silent to the hardship in your life?
