



ACTS – Changed Lives Turning the World Upside Down

Read/Reflect

- 1. Read Acts 17:1-15. How would you advise Paul and Silas after the two incidents of arrest in this passage?
- 2. From the beginning of Acts to chapter 17, what instances of radical change occur as a result of the preaching of the gospel (spoken or lived)?
- 3. What is the source of the controversy that results in Paul & Silas having to escape Thessalonica, and for Paul to sneak out of Berea (17:2-4)? How does preaching "Jesus is the Christ/Lord" cause the world to be turned upside down? (17:6)? Does that still happen today in Canada?

Explore

- 4. What are some ways the gospel turns expected "norms" upside down (think of Jesus' sermon on the mount: Matthew 5-7 -- the beatitudes, and the times Jesus says "You've heard it said... but I say to you...")?
- 5. Do you see instances and places (through your own life or the life of others) where gospel transformation is happening? Where it's not happening and should be?
- 6. What aspects of living the legacy of the apostles do you need to work on? What do each of these aspects look like in your life today?
 - Being passionate about the Gospel story
 - Loving radically
 - □ Not being afraid
 - □ A non-defensive stance towards peace and silence

- Pray for God to equip you or each other with the fruit of the Holy Spirit (Gal.5) so that you can pursue the aspects of "living the legacy" of question 6 above.
