Read/Reflect

- 1. Read Acts 19:1-7. This is a notoriously confusing passage because it raises unanswerable questions, like: 1) were these "disciples" Christian disciples? 2) what did Paul mean in vs.2 by "when you believed?"-- since you can't believe in Jesus without the Holy Spirit (Rom. 8:14-16; Gal. 3:3-5)? 3) why are there no other accounts of "second baptisms (for Apollos, or Paul, or other disciples?) What do you think Luke is after in giving us this account if it is at all reflective of Luke's original theme in Acts 1 & 2?
- 2. Read Acts 19:8-22. The incidents of Acts 19 take place when Paul is in Ephesus on his third missionary journey. List all the cultural engagement Paul gets involved with. What does that say about the missionary enterprise of the church?
- 3. By reviewing Paul's letter to the Ephesians in the New Testament, can you identify links to the background given here in Acts 19? Consider especially the violent reaction to the Gospel in Ephesus (see 19:23-41) and the special assurance that the young believers really belong to Christ and the church in 19:1-7.
