

## ACTS – Faithful Witness Be Strong and Courageous

## Read/Reflect

- Read Acts 21:1-36. How do the Jewish Christians receive Paul as he returns to Jerusalem (21:17-20)?
  What is the issue they fear (21:21-25)? What do the Jews from Asia accuse Paul of doing (21:27-29)?
  What is the reaction of the city (21:30-32)?
- 2. Read Acts 21:37 22:2. What parallels can you identity between Paul's entry into Jerusalem and Jesus' entry into Jerusalem (Luke 19-23)? How does Paul react to the crowds that want to "get rid of him"?

## **Explore**

- 3. What is the offence of the gospel to the crowd hearing Paul's testimony (22:22)? What would make people reject the gospel if they heard your testimony?
- 4. The trouble that Paul finds himself in seems to be a consequence of the tension between tradition and traditionalism. What in Paul's testimony (in Acts 22 or elsewhere in his New Testament writings) convinces you that Paul isn't just a rebel to tradition, and what in his testimony (or elsewhere) convinces you that he is following the truth even when he appears to step away from tradition?
- 5. Luke offers this account of Paul (and of his entire ministry) as more than a personal testimony; it is a pattern that imitates Jesus' ministry, and a pattern of the church's ministry. How might the church of today learn from this pattern and what it means to be strong and courageous?
